"Building work should start in the next two to three months and everyone at the club wants to say thank you to Hills and Community First."

Westbury clinched their second win in succession in their penultimate game of the season by defeating Sherborne 2nd 10-0 in Dorset & Wilts One South.

A Sherborne offside offence gave Kieran McEntegart the opportunity to kick Westbury into the lead, but he then had to leave the field with a knee injury and was replaced by Greg Atkinson.
